

## PROJECT: CSS Zen Garden

### Objective

To create a one-page website with no inline css and only external css formatting and layout.

### Target Audience

An example to attract curious and W3C compliant web designers of the usefulness of semantic mark-up and the benefits of using only an external CSS style sheet.

### Design Approach
